Information on “Conflict Minerals”


Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,

Panasonic Lighting Europe follows the Panasonic policy on “Conflict Minerals” which is published in the Panasonic Sustainability Report on the Panasonic corporate web site.

According to this policy, Panasonic recognizes that for countries in conflict areas (i.e. Democratic Republic of the Congo, and neighbouring nations), the issue of conflict minerals (i.e. tin, tantalum, tungsten, gold) as a source of funding for organizations that are involved in human rights abuses, environmental destruction, bribery, and other unlawful activities is a grave concern.

In order to fulfil its social responsibility in its procurement practices, Panasonic therefore has adopted a policy of non-use of conflict-affected minerals as raw materials. In the unlikely event that Panasonic discovers that it is inadvertently using conflict-affected minerals, the company will immediately take steps toward their non-use.
